



Keep our beaches beautiful

Follow the rules:

- don't remove more sand, stones or driftwood than you can carry
- respect the dunes and don't walk, ride or drive in these areas where access is restricted
- keep dogs under control at all times to preserve wildlife, and prevent nuisance to others
- use signposted beach accessways
- respect rāhui (harvesting restrictions).

Reporting offences

Council Officers and local Police actively patrol beach areas, but can't be everywhere at once. If you see any questionable driving on the beach, call Police (*555) immediately.

Vehicles on the beach

Vehicles:

- are banned on pedestrian accessways to the beach, dune areas and areas where coastal protection works are underway
- are only allowed on the beach in permitted driving and boat launching areas (see map)
- should not exceed 10km/h on vehicle accessways
- should not exceed 20km/h in permitted beach driving areas
- must give way to all other beach users (except in designated boat launching areas where vehicles have right of way).

Two-wheeled and off-road motorbikes are banned from all beach areas.

Parking on the beach: vehicles may only park in boat launching areas if they are launching or retrieving boats or if they display a valid mobility sticker.

Any person who fails to comply with the above is liable to a \$750 fine.

Dogs on the beach

Make sure you know the on and off-leash areas, as well as the prohibited dog zones (see kapiticoast.govt.nz). If you're in an off-leash area, always keep your dog under control!
