1 Please comment on any changes or trends in the Committee's workload in 2024-2025. report: Nigel Wilson, DLC Chair: On the Kapiti Coast there has been an ongoing increase in licence applications for licensed Cafes and restaurants as this is a growing part of the culture of There have been six Hearings during this period which is an increase on the previous period. There has been a large increase in the number of individuals and organisations who have objected to either a new licence or licence renewals. This may well be a trend which will be tested in time. 2 Please comment on any new initiatives the Committee has developed/adopted in 2024-2025. report: Nigel Wilson, DLC Chair: The DLC has instituted a policy relating to deliveries which has been applied to all Off licence renewals and new applications: · All deliveries of alcohol must be signed for by a person aged 18 years or older. Signs of intoxication on the part of the recipient would result in non-delivery. Further the DLC has agreed with a policy position that came out of an MOU between the three reporting agencies: · No single sales of beer or ready to drink spirits (RTDs) in bottles, cans or containers of 500mls or less in volume may occur except for craft beer. The Committee applies the Act as it is currently written. There have been several mixed messages and policy changes from central government that have caused confusion in the sector. The Chair had previously submitted to the Parliamentary Select Committee on proposed reforms to the Act. However there is another policy direction taken up by Government since then.

The Committee recruited two new members who have received training and the interview process established their ability to contribute to the running of the Committee.

Another long-serving committee members (10years this year) is leaving and another member will be recruited.

As the DLC is comprised of four elected members and two external members, the Local Government elections may have an impact on its composition from late October. Provisions have been made for continuity.

2 What changes or trends in licensing have you seen since the Act came into force?

report:

Nigel Wilson, DLC Chair:

There appears to be growing community concern relating to new licences as well as the renewal of some.

The composition of Applicants is also showing a trend, with many in this region being of Indian origin. This is mentioned because in several cases language barriers seem to be impacting the agencies' ability to communicate the seriousness of the requirements for applicants to comply with the provisions of the Act. I am not aware if this is a national trend.

3 What changes to practices and procedures under the Act (if any) would you find beneficial?

report:

Nigel Wilson, DLC Chair:

The Committee will assist with a proposed Local Alcohol Policy which the Kapiti Coast District does not currently have. There appears to be division as to the value of an LAP versus not having one.

The Committee does not have any direct contact with the agencies (except in Hearings) – instead communicating through the democratic services. I think more direct contact could be helpful.
