Kāpiti 2038 Help shape our future

We'd also like to thank everyone who took the time to get involved in July's Kāpiti 2038 Long Term Plan engagement process. Councillors and Council staff will be working with this input as we develop the draft long term plan, which will be shared with the community early in 2018.
