Action Required	Progress
Kiosk at Paraparaumu Beach – Why were water sprinklers not installed in the upgrade of the Kiosk.	Council approved the reinstatement of the kiosk back to the same condition it was before the fire. Due to the size and nature of use of the building, Building Act legislation does not require sprinklers to be installed. Further, there is no water in the building and having it installed would require a new connection to the main supply.
Paekākāriki Station Precinct Trust Lease – KCDC continuing to be guarantors for \$100 a year rent	The Lease has been finalised and signed.
What was the total cost of the installation of the 130 LED luminaires on the local road lighting network.	This information was a transport activity and would be reported at the LTP Workshops
Libraries – Members requested a <u>total</u> of ‘active’ membership	Total borrowers: 42,963 Active borrowers: 28,996 (borrowers who have issued and/or reserved items in the last two years as at November 2014) Both figures exclude SMART borrowers from other libraries
Why was the Kapiti Arts Trail organised on the same weekend as the Toast Martinborough Festival	The Arts trail was held on the 15-16 November because this was the only weekend that Southwards and Nga Purapura were both available. The booking was made eleven months before the event. Other regional arts events were taken into consideration, but it was extremely difficult to find a weekend that did not have a major arts activity happening in the region at this time of the year and when two significant Kāpiti venues were available for the Council managed hubs.
