School Travel Planning			<p><u>School Travel Plan Implementation.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Overall:</i> 16 of the 17 Kāpiti Schools have signed up for the School Travel Plan process, with one school declining. By the end of term 1, 2013 all 16 schools will have completed at least one survey.</li> <li>• <i>Waikanae School:</i> 17 students completed a grade 1 and 2 cycle skills programme. 24 students will be trained in term 1 this year.</li> <li>• <i>Kapanui School:</i> Ongoing monitoring and pedestrian counts at Ngarara Road crossing.</li> <li>• <i>Paraparaumu School:</i> Cycle skills for students' week 7 term 1. Speed radar guns, statistics and civics project term 1.</li> <li>• <i>Raumati Beach School:</i> Grade 1 and 2 cycle skills course run for parent and community volunteers.</li> <li>• <i>Te Ra Waldorf:</i> Shared footpath Matai Road to School has been placed in the footpath contract.</li> <li>• <i>Paraparaumu Beach School:</i> Presentation to regional school travel forum on the Paraparaumu Beach School active travel model.</li> <li>• <i>Paekākāriki School:</i> Planning for grade 1 and 2 cycle skills for parent volunteers. Ongoing cycle skills for students.</li> <li>• <i>Kāpiti Primary School:</i> The school has decided to delay implementing the travel plan until after all the infrastructure works have been completed.</li> </ul> <p><u>School Travel Plan Survey Results</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Ōtaki School:</i> 49% of children driven to school in the family car, the dominant active travel mode was walking at 23%.</li> </ul> <p><u>School Travel Plan Re-survey Results</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Kapanui School:</i> The percentage of trips in the family car has reduced by 6% from 57% 2011 to 51% in 2012.</li> <li>• <i>Paraparaumu School:</i> In 2009 60% of students driven to school in the family car in 2012 it was down to 48%.</li> <li>• <i>Kāpiti Primary School:</i> There has been no shift in travel modes between the two surveys. <b>Resource Consents</b>			<p><u>Appeals</u></p> <p>The hearing to review the decision by the Commissioner to grant Consent RM110144 to allow Mr R Hawke to build a dwelling at 51A The Parade, Paekākāriki was set down for 21 and 22 February. At the commencement of the hearing the appellant advised the court that a settlement could be reached. Draft conditions agreed by all parties have been sent to the Environment Court as instructed and parties are awaiting the court's decision.</p> <p>The Rymans Healthcare Limited appeal regarding several conditions has been settled.</p> <p>The hearing for an objection received from Bunnings Limited (in relation to the additional costs incurred by the Council in processing this publicly notified resource consent application) was set down for Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> February. This hearing has since been postponed. A new hearing date will be set pending availability of those parties involved.</p>
