PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1 Five applications for a Discretionary Grant have been received from:
 - Soroptimists International Kāpiti Coast
 - Kāpiti ADHD/ADD Support Group
 - MOA Community Orchard Organising Committee
 - Proactive Arts Collective
 - Siggy Woolloff

These applications comply with the Discretionary Grants criteria and need to be considered by the Paraparaumu/Raumati Community Board.

BACKGROUND

- 3 An amount of \$20,370 was provided in the 2012/13 budget for the Community Grants Fund. This is the third allocation of grants for the 2012/13 year.

Applications from the Community Grant Fund

Soroptimists International Kāpiti Coast

- 7 Nicolette Veltman, on behalf of the Soroptimists International Kāpiti Coast has applied for a grant of \$300 to assist with costs to support a Service Project aimed at residents living in Council owned flats throughout Kāpiti.

This application can be considered under Eligible Purposes 2; *Special project or activity*.

Kāpiti ADHD/HDD Support Group

- 8 Kāpiti ADHD/ADD Support Group has applied for a grant of \$253 to purchase a book and set of DVDs on raising children with ADHD/ADD and managing their challenging behaviours called “Challenging Behaviours Resource Kit”.

MOA Community Orchard Organising Committee

- 9 Cree Hatfield, on behalf of the MOA Community Orchard Organising Committee has applied for a grant of \$294 to cover costs for signage.
