KAPITI COAST AIRPORT NOISE MANAGEMENT PLAN REVIEW (SP-12-627)

Mr James Kilbride spoke regarding the review of the Airport Noise Management Plan. A fairly in-depth review was carried out a few years ago and there were not a lot of changes from this review. Mr Kilbride pointed out the changes to the report, most of which were administrative. A more recent change, not included in the report, was to the change of ownership. The Todd family had bought the majority shareholding of the airport. Mr Kilbride advised in the last 12 months there was a reduction in helicopter operations. Therefore, a helicopter operator has been removed as a requirement on the Community Liaison Group (CLG), but this does not preclude a helicopter operator from being on the CLG.
