The new basketball area has been concreted and the project is on track to be completed in June 2019.</p> <p>The upgrade of Maclean Park is progressing well. The terraced steps are now complete; the BBQ's and furniture are in place and the shelter is almost complete. There has been a lot of work to form the new levels and preparing the base layers and boxing for the main central path and we expect the concrete will be poured soon week subject to weather. There has been a minor delay with the prefabricated concrete wall that forms the edge of the ramp next to the terraced stairs and leads to the BBQ area. The wall will be installed at the end of June meaning the final touches will take place in the first week of July. We are aiming to have the new area open to the public in the second week of July.</p> <p>The selected artist for the public art commission for Maclean Park is expected to present the detailed design for the artwork to the Public Art Panel in August 2019. A briefing could be presented to the Board at its next meeting.</p> <p>The Council agreed to investigate the viability of a 'Kāpiti Island Gateway'.
