SLOW DOWN
AND BE PREPARED TO **STOP!**

COURTESY CROSSINGS
are **NOT** official pedestrian crossings.

They are usually paved and are raised,
but they **DON'T HAVE WHITE LINES.**

They provide a place where drivers can
stop safely to allow pedestrians to cross.

However, drivers are **NOT OBLIGED**
TO STOP at courtesy crossings, so
pedestrians should use them with
care!

They are usually a **contrast colour** to
the road.

**PEDESTRIANS
GIVE WAY
TO TRAFFIC**

It takes
an alert
driver 1.5
seconds to react
to a pedestrian
crossing the road and
brake. In that time, at
50km/h, a car covers
21 metres on the
road.
