DRAFT CALENDAR OF MEETINGS 2019

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1 Council is asked to approve a draft meeting schedule from January 2019 through to September 2019 (the end of the triennium).

DELEGATION

2 Council has the authority to consider this matter.

BACKGROUND

3 Council needs to consider and adopt its proposed Council, Standing Committee, Community Board and Subcommittee meetings schedule from January 2019 to September 2019 (see Appendix 1).

ISSUES AND OPTIONS

Issues

- The meetings detailed in Appendix 1 are generally based on a six-weekly cycle. A six-weekly cycle allows for substantial progression of issues. Statutory requirements indicate that meeting agendas must be received by meeting participants at least two clear working days ahead of the meeting date a standard which is exceeded in order to give Elected Members as much time as possible to consider the reports and associated information.
- 5 The six-weekly cycle results in a number of 'quiet' spots in the calendar during which there may be briefings or training activities, and breaks.
- Reports going forward to any Council, Standing Committee, Community Board or Subcommittee meeting undergo an internal peer review process to ensure that the information, advice and options provided are of high quality. These processes, both statutory and operational, add to the lead time required for the comprehensive consideration of issues.
- 7 Elected Members are invited to consider the following points in respect of the draft calendar of meetings:

Meeting start times

 Council and Standing Committee meetings take place on a Thursday and will begin at 10.00 am. All Community Board meetings are scheduled to take place on Tuesday evenings with Ōtaki, Waikanae, Paekākāriki and Paraparaumu-Raumati Community Board meetings to commence at 7.00 pm.

Briefings

Briefings are scheduled to take place on a Thursday from 8.15 am –
 9.25 am and sometimes after Committee meetings. These briefings are primarily intended to keep Elected Members up to date with key projects and issues.

Other meetings

- The Audit and Risk Committee will meet quarterly.
- The Appeals Hearing Committee and District Licensing Committee meet as required.
- The draft calendar also features meeting dates for Te Whakaminenga o Kāpiti.
- The calendar of meetings features meeting dates for bodies which administer grants. These are the Grants Allocation Committee and the Campe Estate Subcommittee.

Changes to the Calendar

From time to time meetings have to be re-scheduled or cancelled for unavoidable reasons. If this has to be done, the matter is discussed initially with the Mayor and/or the Chair of the respective Committee before Elected Members are informed and consulted as to proposed alternative dates if any. Any changes to the meeting schedule are publicly advertised, and notified in the Calendar of Meetings found in the Elected Members Bulletin circulated each Friday to Elected Members. Cancellation notices include the reasons for cancelling.

CONSIDERATIONS

Policy considerations

8 There are no policy considerations.

Legal considerations

9 There is no statutory requirement to set a calendar of meetings but it is practical to do so to fulfil the requirement under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (Section 46) to publicly notify meetings.

Financial considerations

10 There are no financial considerations.

Tāngata whenua considerations

11 There are no tangata whenua considerations arising from this report.

SIGNIFICANCE AND ENGAGEMENT

12 This matter has a low level of significance under Council policy.

Consultation

13 The draft 2019 calendar will be formally circulated through all four Community Boards.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 14 That Council approves the draft meeting schedule for January 2019 end of the triennium as detailed in Appendix 1 of report Corp-18-625 noting the following:
 - the calendar of meetings is based on a six-weekly cycle;
 - Council, Committee and Subcommittee meetings are generally scheduled on a Thursday and start at 10.00 am; and
 - as a general rule, Community Board meetings will take place on Tuesday evenings, commencing at 7.00 pm for Ōtaki, Waikanae, Paekākāriki and Paraparaumu-Raumati Community Boards.
