Easter Shop Trading Submission

Retail NZ is a not for profit organisation representing the interests of the retail sector. We have around 4,200 members nationally, who collectively account for two-thirds of total retail turn over in New Zealand. Our members operate all around the country, and have a strong presence in the Kapiti Coast District. We are writing to make some additional comments in a formal submission on the Council's efforts to develop a Local Shop Trading Hours Policy in Kapiti.

We strongly support the introduction of a policy

While not all retailers wish to open for trade on Easter Sunday, there are many that do. Therefore, we strongly recommend that the Kapiti Coast District Council adopt a policy that permits any retailer to open on Easter Sunday, if it chooses to do so.

In the 21st century, the current law is outdated and full on anomalies. The law allows for certain businesses or locations to be open, while not permitting others. For example, a garden centre may open, yet a hardware store that includes a garden centre is not permitted to open. Cafés that sell goods and small grocery stores may open, but not supermarkets. This created a significant confusion for customers, employers and staff, and gives some retailers an advantage over others.

Should the Council adopt a policy, it is likely not all retailers will choose to open their doors on Easter Sunday. However, we believe that the decision is best made by shop owners and managers of the businesses in concern, in consensus with their employees, and not a decision to be made by the Council.

The rights of small business are protected

If the Council adopts a policy, the rights of small businesses to remain closed are firmly protected. Under the legislation, no business can be forced to open. Businesses will not open if there is no customer demand for them to do so.

The rights of employees are also protected

As Easter Sunday is not a public holiday there is no legal requirement for employees to be paid if their shop is closed. While it does depend on the details of employment contracts, in many cases, employees are required to take a day's annual leave to cover the day the store is closed. This will suit some employees, but not all.













Under the new legislation, shop employees have a guaranteed right that they cannot be forced to work on Easter Sunday. This means that their rights to a day off, on the same basis as now, are guaranteed.

Adopting a policy will support businesses and make the Kapiti Coast a more attractive tourist destination

Easter is a significant period for Kiwi tourists to explore the country, as well as international tourists. Many people travel through, to and within the Kapiti Coast District at Easter, and it would benefit the retail businesses throughout the District if they had the choice as to whether they open or not to serve that tourist market.

We operate in a globalised 24/7 shopping market, which means Kiwis can and do shop online over Easter, and there is consumer demand for retail activity over Easter Sunday. A recent ACNielsen survey shows that 51 per cent of all New Zealanders participated in some form of shopping on Easter Sunday this year, despite restrictions in many council districts

We would also like to note that nearly half of all Councils around New Zealand have now adopted policies that permit retail businesses to open on Easter Sunday.

Our submission on the proposed Local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy is that the Council should NOT adopt this policy. The basis for our submission is as follows: Easter Sunday is a significant day in the Christian calendar and should be respected and retained as a non-trading day Easter Sunday is the day when Christians from around the world celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and the new life that his resurrection brings. It is arguably the most important day in the Christian calendar and is one of the few days of the year when almost the entire community has the opportunity to take time out to practice their religious and cultural beliefs. This has traditionally been at church services but can also be done privately without the pressure of having to work. We believe that this tradition is critically important to our community and needs to be protected from becoming just another trading day, which would happen if the Council were to adopt the proposed policy on Easter Sunday shop trading. There is no compelling economic reason to change The Kapiti Coast is not a prime tourist destination but rather has a more balanced economy and does not rely on tourism for a significant percentage of revenue. The addition of one more shop trading day will, in our opinion, not make a substantial positive difference to revenue generation in our district but would make a substantial negative difference to the quality of life for all those in our community who work in the retail industry. The addition of one shop trading day into the full trading year is insignificant in terms of revenue. We understand that no person would be required to work on that day and if they are, then they are entitled to take a personal grievance. In real terms, that protection is at best minimal and at worst non-existent. In today's competitive job environment and at a time when many people have to work at two jobs to meet rising costs of housing, power, fuel, health care, food and other essentials, individuals who refused to work on Easter Sunday know they disadvantage themselves both financially and for future work. The pressure to do this is subtle and intangible but never the less, very real. Council must protect our community from this pressure and not adopt this proposed policy. The proposed policy would weaken the community at a time it needs to be strong New Zealand and our district currently face a range of issues that impact upon the quality of life. Statistics show that youth suicide is at record levels and that mental health issues for all are increasing. Divorce rates and single parent families indicate a deterioration in family units which provide support both internally and across the community. We see that the pressure for families to earn increasing wages to meet increasing costs is a major contributor to these declines. Easter Sunday is a day in the year when that pressure is relieved and allows time for families to take a break, refresh and reconnect and simply spend time together in conversation. We also believe that attending a church service with the positive messages of hope and forgiveness that come from the account of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday makes a major contribution to the cohesive strength of both families and communities. The proposed policy would destroy that opportunity and further weaken the bonds of our community. Instead of Easter Sunday being a day of hope, peace and refreshment, it becomes just another trading day. Instead of Easter Sunday being a time when people can connect and support one another, thus addressing many of the underlying causes of poor mental health, people will be at work just like any other trading day. Rather than bow to the commercial pressure from a small part of the community, the Council should make the most of what Easter Sunday currently provides We believe that the proposed shop trading policy is a missed opportunity for the Council to build and develop our community. Instead of adopting the proposed policy, we believe the Council should work with the churches and community groups to utilise the day for community

development. Council should adopt a policy to take a positive lead in a range of community based engagement events across the district on Easter Sunday. These events should compliment the traditional Sunday morning services and provide time and opportunity for everyone to gather, share positive messages of hope, provide support for those who need it and have fun. This policy would differentiate the Kapiti Coast and not only provide a great platform for residents but would also provide a showcase to attract those from outside the district, showing that community development and quality of life on the Kapiti Coast take precedent over dubious commercial gains. We would certainly be prepared to support such a positive policy for our district and work with Council to make it a reality for our community.

Proposed Local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy

Submission from The Hub Community Church

The Hub Community Church is a community based Christian church with a physical base in Otaki and a number of hub groups meeting in homes across the Kapiti Coast district. We have 168 members living between Paraparaumu to Manakau and we are registered with the Charities Service.

Our submission on the proposed Local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy is that the Council should **NOT** adopt this policy.

We wish to make a verbal submission to the Council.

The basis for our submission is as follows:

Easter Sunday is a significant day in the Christian calendar and should be respected and retained as a non-trading day

Easter Sunday is the day when Christians from around the world celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and the new life that his resurrection brings. It is arguably the most important day in the Christian calendar and is one of the few days of the year when almost the entire community has the opportunity to take time out to practice their religious and cultural beliefs. This has traditionally been at church services but can also be done privately without the pressure of having to work.

We believe that this tradition is critically important to our community and needs to be protected from becoming just another trading day, which would happen if the Council were to adopt the proposed policy on Easter Sunday shop trading.

There is no compelling economic reason to change

The Kapiti Coast is not a prime tourist destination but rather has a more balanced economy and does not rely on tourism for a significant percentage of revenue. The addition of one more shop trading day will, in our opinion, not make a substantial positive difference to revenue generation in our district but would make a substantial negative difference to the quality of life for all those in our community who work in the retail industry.

The addition of one shop trading day into the full trading year is insignificant in terms of revenue.

We understand that no person would be required to work on that day and if they are, then they are entitled to take a personal grievance. In real terms, that protection is at best minimal and at worst non-existent. In today's competitive job environment and at a time when many people have to work at two jobs to meet rising costs of housing, power, fuel, health care, food and other essentials, individuals who refused to work on Easter Sunday know they disadvantage themselves both financially and for future work. The pressure to

do this is subtle and intangible but never the less, very real. Council must protect our community from this pressure and not adopt this proposed policy.

The proposed policy would weaken the community at a time it needs to be strong

New Zealand and our district currently face a range of issues that impact upon the quality of life. Statistics show that youth suicide is at record levels and that mental health issues for all are increasing. Divorce rates and single parent families indicate a deterioration in family units which provide support both internally and across the community. We see that the pressure for families to earn increasing wages to meet increasing costs is a major contributor to these declines.

Easter Sunday is a day in the year when that pressure is relieved and allows time for families to take a break, refresh and reconnect and simply spend time together in conversation. We also believe that attending a church service with the positive messages of hope and forgiveness that come from the account of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday makes a major contribution to the cohesive strength of both families and communities.

The proposed policy would destroy that opportunity and further weaken the bonds of our community. Instead of Easter Sunday being a day of hope, peace and refreshment, it becomes just another trading day. Instead of Easter Sunday being a time when people can connect and support one another, thus addressing many of the underlying causes of poor mental health, people will be at work just like any other trading day.

Rather than bow to the commercial pressure from a small part of the community, the Council should make the most of what Easter Sunday currently provides

We believe that the proposed shop trading policy is a missed opportunity for the Council to build and develop our community. Instead of adopting the proposed policy, we believe the Council should work with the churches and community groups to utilise the day for community development.

Council should adopt a policy to take a positive lead in a range of community based engagement events across the district on Easter Sunday. These events should compliment the traditional Sunday morning services and provide time and opportunity for everyone to gather, share positive messages of hope, provide support for those who need it and have fun.

This policy would differentiate the Kapiti Coast and not only provide a great platform for residents but would also provide a showcase to attract those from outside the district, showing that community development and quality of life on the Kapiti Coast take precedent over dubious commercial gains.

We would certainly be prepared to support such a positive policy for our district and work with Council to make it a reality for our community.

Easter Sunday is regarded as a special day by many Kapiti residents and others. Easter Sunday is regarded as a special day by many New Zealanders, including, but not limited to, those who identify themselves as Christians. It is the day when Christians all over the world take part in worship and prayer in remembrance of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. For many also, whether identifying as Christians or not, it is a special day of rest and relaxation. 2. More Kapiti residents are of Christian religious affiliation than any other religious affiliation We note that according to the 2013 census, 22,440 people marked themselves as Christian, with a further 267 who marked themselves as "Maori Christian". This was out of a total of 45,888 of those who chose to answer the question. In other words the percentage Christian of those who chose to answer was almost half the total respondents (49.5%), or 45.7% of the total Kapiti population. This compared with 20,490 people who marked themselves as having "no religion". The next highest religion was Buddhism, with just 393 adherents. (Spreadsheet of census results attached.) On the basis of these figures we believe that it is reasonable to assume that the majority of residents would prefer to retain Easter Sunday as a special national day, which is also regarded as special by many people of other religions and viewpoints. 3. Abolition of restriction of Easter Sunday trading would discriminate against retail workers. According to union information there are only now 3 1/2 days per year when retail workers are guaranteed a day off. We believe that leisure time is the right of every New Zealander, and would be resistant to add one more pressure to families who want to spend time with their children. 4. Central government protections for workers affected by this legislation are inadequate. We are aware the legislation would give opportunities for staff to decline work "with no reason necessary". However, it seems possible that "power relations" in the workplace may render this promise unreliable. Many workers may not be fully aware of their entitlements regarding the day off. Although theoretically retailers have a choice, this is not always as straightforward as it may appear, as some employees are not always easily replaced. Workers on a 90-day trial agreement who refuse to work could be at risk of dismissal. As Easter Sunday is not a public holiday, there is no guarantee even of extra pay. 5. Public policy should encourage families to spend quality and quantity time together At a time when New Zealand experienced 606 suicides last year, extreme care should be taken to make sure public policy should pay due regard to the welfare of all New Zealanders. Introduction

The local churches listed above would like to make a submission to Council opposing the proposal to adopt an Easter Sunday shop trading policy, with reasons as follows.

1. Easter Sunday is regarded as a special day by many Kapiti residents and others.

Easter Sunday is regarded as a special day by many New Zealanders, including, but not limited to, those who identify themselves as Christians. It is the day when Christians all over the world take part in worship and prayer in remembrance of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. For many also, whether identifying as Christians or not, it is a special day of rest and relaxation.

2. More Kapiti residents are of Christian religious affiliation than any other religious affiliation

We note that according to the 2013 census, 22,440 people marked themselves as Christian, with a further 267 who marked themselves as "Maori Christian". This was out of a total of 45,888 of those who chose to answer the question. In other words the percentage Christian of those who chose to answer was almost half the total respondents (49.5%), or 45.7% of the total Kapiti population. According to the study, mattering is composed of three factors – awareness, importance, and reliance. Do others know you exist? Do they invest time and resources in you? Do they look to you as a resource? Elliott asserts that mattering is the fundamental motivation in human beings.

The data for this analysis comes from telephone interviews with a sample of 2,004 adolescents, age 11-18, as part of the 2000 Youth Risk Behavior Survey. Controlling for age, gender, race, religiosity, and family socioeconomic structure and size, the findings reveal that failing to matter to one's family increases the probability of violence, whereas a strong feeling of mattering is likely to protect the adolescent from engaging in violent behavior toward a family member.¹

In our opinion, adequate time with family is a core need in today's society and it therefore seems inadvisable to load just one more pressure on retail workers and their families, who would clearly benefit from spending quality time together.

Submission on Easter Sunday Shop Trading

Coastlands Shoppingtown Limited supports the proposed KCDC policy that shop trading be allowed on Easter Sunday.

Kapiti Coast District Council has an open for business policy and the ability for shops to make their own decisions on trading based on the business economics of doing so, would support the open for business policy. It seems incongruous that you could have an open for business policy that had a sub clause, "except on Easter Sunday".

The policy of allowing business to make their own decision on opening on Easter Sunday will stop the nonsense where some retailers are able to open for instance garden centres but others which may have a garden centre within them such as Mitre 10 Mega are not allowed to open. A blanket policy that allows all retailers to make a decision is fairer and more equitable.

With the modern retail environment shoppers are able to shop via the internet twenty four hours a day seven days a week. To restrict those shops without an online presence would seem unfair.

Within the legislation enabling Easter Trading there are adequate provisions for employees to say no to working on Easter Sunday. This is the only day of the year that employees will be entitled to do so and is a very strong provision.

Coastlands Shoppingtown does not know whether it will open Easter Sunday if the policy is adopted as it relies on its individual tenants to open to create the ambience needed for a shopping mall. In this regard it will be led by the tenant's wishes and will need a substantial majority of the shops to be open for it to be worthwhile to open the doors.

In summary, Coastlands believes that the Council should adopt the policy of allowing retail trading on Easter Sundays. It believes that individual choice of shop owners should be respected and that the legislation surrounding this policy provides suitable safeguards for all employees.

Background

- 1. FIRST Union is a private sector union with more than 27,500 members across several sectors including retail, finance, textile, clothing, baking, wood, transport and logistics. We are the primary union for retail workers. In Kāpiti we represent workers in the supermarkets, Bunnings, Farmers, the Cotton On group, the Warehouse, and some of the smaller retail outlets. We also represent members in the major trading banks who are located in the mall and the regional shopping centres. The proposed policy will have a major impact on retail workers, bank workers of branches located in malls, and their families and whānau.
- 2. We oppose the opening of shops on Easter Sunday in the Kāpiti District.
- 3. Currently retail workers in Kāpiti are guaranteed only three and a half days off each year. These days must be protected, not reduced.
- 4. Families, whānau and communities should come before commerce at Easter. For some retail and bank workers Easter is an important time to take part in religious observance. For others, it is a time to be part of family or whānau gatherings, sports tournaments and other community activities.
- 5. We note that, according to the 'Statement of Proposal', it is business that has requested 'a policy to enable Easter Sunday trading'¹. While business is important it is only one part of the vibrant community that is the Kāpiti Coast. The paper goes on to state that 'Easter Sunday is a significant day in the religious calendar for many Kāpiti residents (and that) a significant proportion of (the) District identify as Christian' and that other community feedback opposes the proposed policy as they 'desire to keep it as a family day and/or to retain the day as a holiday'². It is the voice of the broader community that the Council should listen to.

Workers Choice

- 6. Much is made of workers having the absolute right to refuse to work if their workplace is open on Easter Sunday. There is the right for workers to raise a personal grievance where they have been compelled to work on Easter Sunday or suffer a disadvantage for refusing to work on that day. However in the real world it is not so easy to refuse to work the day when requested by the employer, nor is it that easy for an employee to take a personal grievance against his/her employer. For example:
 - Some decades ago retail workers were given the same 'rights'
 when shops were opened for Sunday shopping and workers were
 told that they would never have to work on a Sunday if they did
 not want to. Of course today almost all retail workers are
 required to work either a Saturday or a Sunday and some are
 required to work both days.
 - Pressure will be exerted on individual workers to work on Easter Sunday. Workers will be told that she/he is not a team player, they may be passed over for promotion and may not get performance based pay rises. The pressure to conform will overcome the 'right' to refuse for many workers.
 - Many retail and bank workers report difficulties with their employer when they request a day off on a public holiday or other busy trading days. The union has no confidence in businesses complying with the Act and respecting a worker's right to refuse to work on Easter Sunday.
 - The raising of a personal grievance is not as easy as it seems. It is a legal process and most workers need advice and representation as they go through the process. It is also a fairly slow process that can take months, or in some cases years, to resolve. For those workers who are union members, their union will support them, however most other workers will be forced to seek legal advice at significant cost if they want to pursue a personal grievance. The reality is that most workers will not have the ability to take a personal grievance, and therefore it is unlikely that the threat of a

- personal grievance will act as a disincentive to employers from requiring workers to work on Easter Sunday.
- For someone employed under the 90 day trial period there is no right to take a personal grievance against the employer. Only a very brave worker would refuse the employer's request to work on Easter Sunday while under a 90 day trial.
- 7. Easter Sunday is not a public holiday. Workers who work on Easter Sunday are not entitled to time and a half, nor are they entitled to a day in lieu. If this policy is passed those workers who do work on Easter Sunday will see it treated like any other Sunday.
- 8. This is what our members who work in retail and banking and will be affected by the adoption of the policy have to say about Easter Sunday becoming a trading day as proposed by the council paper:
 - 'Easter Sunday is a time that I spend with my family. I work every Sunday so this is the only Sunday that I am guaranteed to have off work' – Lynette
 - 'You should be able to have one day with your family, or go to church if you want to. It's one bloody day out of the three and a half days we get!' Virginia

Conclusion

- 9. The policy paper recommends that trading be allowed on Easter Sunday throughout the Kāpiti Coast. Currently there are only three and a half days that shops and banks are required to close so to cut this down to two and a half days is significant. Retail and bank workers and their families and whānau are the ones who will suffer if this policy is passed. For those who work Monday to Friday, including we suspect the authors of this policy, little changes except that there is one more day to go shopping. It is retail and bank workers who will be pressured to work on Easter Sunday and there will be many who won't be able to refuse their employer's request to work. It is these workers who will bear the brunt of Easter Sunday trading if this policy is passed.
- 10.FIRST Union strongly opposes this recommendation and argues that the status quo should be maintained. We also note that the Kāpiti Coast

District Council Long Term Plan states that 'We provide opportunities for the community to participate in activities and events that encourage community resilience.' We believe that community resilience would be eroded should the policy go ahead. Currently Easter Sunday is one of only three and a half days a year that working people in retail can count on as a day off to attend such events, or to spend time with their family or friends, or to attend church. Kāpiti Coast is a family friendly city so let's keep Easter Sunday as a day when families and whanau can spend time together free of commerce.

Proposed Local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy

 A Draft Local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy has been developed for consultation with the Kāpiti Coast community. If adopted, this policy will enable more shops to open on Easter Sunday. If the policy is not adopted, the current situation of a small number of shops being able to open will remain.

Background

- 2. The Shop Trading Hours Amendment Act 2016 modified the Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 (the Act), providing an opportunity for the council to consider whether to draft and adopt a Local Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy to enable more shops to open on Easter Sunday, or whether to retain the status quo.
- 3. Before this legislation change, most shops had to remain closed on three and a half days of the year Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Anzac Day (until 1pm) and Christmas Day. Limited types of shops, such as dairies and service stations, were able to open and some areas, such as Tāupo, which were seen as tourist destinations and had exemptions that allowed trade.
- 4. The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) has responsibility for the implementation of the Act. More information can be accessed from the MBIE website, including:
 - Legislation The Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 (amended 2016)
 - Q&A on the Easter Sunday Shop Trading law change (including advice to employers and employees)
 - · Additional information from MBIE

Community views

- 5. Across the country, communities have been considering whether to adopt a policy to enable Easter Sunday trading. During consultation on the adoption of an Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy in other communities a variety of viewpoints have been expressed by businesses, churches, families and workers.
- 6. Around the region, councils have approached this decision differently. Currently, only the Wairarapa councils have adopted a policy. Earlier this year, Porirua City Council voted against the adoption of a policy after community consultation found that 66% of submitters did not want to see shops open on Easter Sunday. Similarly, Hutt City Council decided to not progress a policy after their preconsultation found that 64% of submitters were not supportive of such a change. Horowhenua is considering the adoption of a district-wide policy at their 30 August meeting, and Upper Hutt is currently doing some informal consultation. Wellington City Council is likely to consider a policy later this year.
- 7. Kapiti Coast District Council recognises the important contribution our business community makes to the economy of the District and is responding to requests from that community to explore the development of a local policy. The Chamber of Commerce has asked for a policy to enable Easter Sunday trading and there have also been two requests from national bodies representing retail. Adopting a policy will give certainty to businesses and the public.

- 8. Easter Sunday is a significant day in the religious calendar for many Kāpiti residents. A significant proportion of District identify as Christian (2013 Census data).
- 9. Feedback from the community has included other reasons for opposing the adoption of a policy, such as the desire to keep it a family day and/or to retain the day as a holiday.

What a policy can and can't do

- 10. There is no legal requirement to have an Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy, and what can be achieved with a policy is tightly defined. The policy can only enable trading. The Act does not allow a policy to:
 - permit shops to open only for some purposes; or
 - permit only some types of shop to open; or
 - specify times at which shops may or may not open; or
 - include any other conditions as the circumstances in which shops in the area may open.
- 11. The Council can decide to have a policy which enables Easter Sunday shop trading for the whole or part(s) of the District. The shop trading policy must include a map of the area to which the policy applies and a clear description of the boundaries of the area so that they are easily identifiable in practice.
- 12. The Council does not have an enforcement role for Easter Sunday trading; this role remains with MBIE. Information on this role is also provided in the above links.
- 13. If the Council decides not to enable trading, the policy would not be adopted and the status quo would continue; meaning that limited types of shops, such as dairies and service stations are able to open.

Timing

- 14. A decision on the adoption of a policy would optimally be made this calendar year if Easter Sunday trading was to be enabled for next year. This would ensure plenty of time for business planning and for discussions with employees. It is possible, however, to adopt a policy early next year and still enable trading for Easter Sunday 2018 given the notice period to employees required under the Act.
- 15. There are provisions in the Shop Trading Act to support the negotiation between employers and employees about working on Easter Sunday and a provision which seeks to protect the employee should they choose not to work. Under the Act, employers need to provide their employees with a written notice of their right to refuse to work on Easter Sunday. The notice can be provided in the period between eight weeks and four weeks before Easter Sunday (which is on 1 April in 2018). Employees also have this notice period to notify their employers of their refusal to work on Easter Sunday (note employees do not have to provide a reason for not working on Easter Sunday).

Should the Kapiti Coast District Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy cover the whole or part(s) of the District?

16. Whether the policy should cover the whole or part(s) of the District has been considered, and the following options are possible:

Option 1 - Keep the status quo

The Council could choose not to have a policy. There is no legal requirement to have a policy and there are likely to be a range of views in the community. However, the Council has decided to draft a policy to promote community debate and give certainty to businesses and the public. If the decision is made not to have a policy, this decision could be revisited at any time.

Option 2 - Limit shop trading to part(s) of Kāpiti

This option could include limiting the policy to only allow shops to open in particular towns or village centres. One benefit of this approach is that Council could respond to differing community opinions if, for example, one community had a majority in favour of the policy while another community had a majority against the policy. However, considering the small size of the Kāpiti Coast and the spread of beachside and inland retail nodes, this option is not recommended as it could cause confusion and dilute the opportunity to promote the District as an attraction to visitors.

Option 3 - Allow trading throughout the District

This option would allow shops throughout the District to trade on Easter Sunday. It would be up to individual retailers to choose whether to trade.

17. Having considered the three options, Option 3 is recommended as doing so allows the Council to propose a policy for consultation purposes, in line with the Local Government Act 2002.

Decision process

- 18. The Council has drafted a policy that covers the whole District and is beginning a formal consultation process to give the community a chance to give their views. The Council must use the special consultative procedure, as detailed in section 83 of the Local Government Act 2002.
- 19. The key dates in this consultation process are provided below:

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this policy is to enable shops to trade on Easter Sunday if they wish. This policy is made under Part 2 (subpart 1) of the Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 (the Act). Easter Sunday is a significant day in the religious calendar for many New Zealanders. Some businesses will choose not to open and some workers will choose not to work on this day.

2. POLICY OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE

The objective of this policy is to enable Easter Sunday Trading and support a vibrant, diverse and thriving Kāpiti.

This policy applies to the whole of the Kāpiti Coast District (see Schedule 1 Map) and does not apply to the sale and supply of alcohol, which is regulated under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

3. STRATEGIC ALIGNMENT

This policy supports the vision for the Kapiti Coast as vibrant, diverse and thriving and contributes to the following Council Outcomes:

- Thriving economy support the unique character of the various geographic communities and communities of interest while encouraging greater district integration
- Democracy through community participation create easy opportunities throughout the council decision making process for the community to contribute.

4. DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this policy, the meaning of a shop is the same as defined in section 2 of the Act:

'a building, place, or part of a building or place, where goods are kept, sold, or offered for sale, by retail; and includes an auction mart, and a barrow, stall, or other subdivision of a market; but does not include:

- (a) a private home where the owner or occupier's effects are being sold (by auction or otherwise); or
- (b) a building or place where the only business carried on is that of selling by auction agricultural products, pastoral products, and livestock, or any of them; or

(c) a building or place where the only business carried on is that of selling goods to people who are dealers, and buy the goods to sell them again'

5. POLICY

The Policy of the Kapiti Coast District Council is as follows:

Shop trading is permitted on Easter Sundays throughout the whole of the Kapiti Coast District as defined by the map in Schedule 1

Individual retailers will choose whether to open on Easter Sunday. This policy does not require shops to open on Easter Sunday, nor does it require individuals to shop on Easter Sunday or require employees to work on Easter Sunday. The workers choice provision in Part 2 (subpart 2) of the Shop Trading Hours Act 1990 that outlines a shop employee's right to refuse to work on Easter Sunday supports this right.

6. MONITORING

The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment is responsible for enforcement of breaches of shop trading hours on Easter Sundays and the imposition of penalties.

7. REVIEW

This policy is required to be reviewed at least every five years from the date of adoption.
