Request for Information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act) (the LGOIMA)

Thank you for your email of **29 May 2023** requesting the following information:

1. Have CAP/KCDC shared the feedback from the online survey and the number of contributors to it?

The PowerPoint presentation NAA Capturing Values to Inform Objectives Presentation – CAP Workshop 29 March 2023 shared that approximately 300 responses were received regarding the Northern Adaptation Area. The key themes that emerged from this feedback was:

- 1. Food basket for our community
- 2. Beach access for recreation and public use
- 3. Natural environment values
- 4. Cultural heritage and richness of Māori culture
- 5. Health and wellbeing of our community (current and future)
- 6. Governance Making it happen

2. How did the online survey feedback differ from the workshop feedback?

The Have Your Say survey results did not greatly differ from the community workshop that was held in Ōtaki on 24 September 2022, nor from the feedback that was received from the following engagements:

- Ōtaki Library meet and greet (June 2022)
- Te Horo Country market (June 2022)
- Rangatahi session (31 August 2022)
- Ōtaki Expo (24 September 2022)
- Have Your Say map pin board (September 2022 March 2023)
- Local newspaper survey: Ōtaki Mail (March 2023)

3. Have CAP/KCDC shared a summary of the combined feedback on the northern adaptation area from the workshop, the online survey, and any other community sources considered?

4. Have CAP/KCDC sought any community feedback on the draft objective presented in this newsletter? (The newsletter does not explicitly request any feedback).

CAP have not sought community feedback on the objective for the Northern Adaptation Area. The CAP will be seeking feedback on their draft adaptation pathways for the Northern Adaptation Area at the community feedback session on 1 July 2023 at Ōtaki Baptist Church, corner State Highway 1 and Te Manuao Road, Ōtaki, 10.30am – 12.30pm.

5. Why does the Panel's draft objective make no provisions for the safe and sustainable occupation (as long as is practically possible) of the northern adaptation area's coastal sites, communities, and infrastructure likely to be impacted by SLR?

Based on the approximately 300 feedback responses received from the community engagements as listed in Question 2, provisions for the safe and sustainable occupation of the Northern Adaptation Area's coastal sites, communities, and infrastructure was not a common theme. Instead, the main themes were as outlined in answer to Question 1. Therefore, it is not shown within the CAP's objective for the Northern Adaptation Area. It is expected that each objective for each adaptation area will vary depending on the community's values.

Further to this, we acknowledge that safe and sustainable occupation options will likely inform the criteria for which Council considers CAP's recommendations for short, medium and longer term response.
