# ALCOHOL REGULATORY AND LICENSING AUTHORITY (ARLA) ANNUAL REPORT - JULY 2017 TO JUNE 2018

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1 This report is to inform the Council of the contents of the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority (ARLA) Annual Report that is required to be provided to ARLA each year pursuant to Section 199 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act).

#### **DELEGATION**

- 2 The Operations and Finance Committee has delegated authority to consider this matter under Section B.2 of the Governance Structure and Delegations:
  - 'This Committee will deal with monitoring and decision-making on all broader financial management matters. Key responsibilities will include all regulatory and planning matters from an operational perspective'.

#### BACKGROUND

Within three months of the end of every financial year, every territorial authority must prepare and send to ARLA a report of the proceedings and operations of its licensing committee during the year.

#### **ISSUES AND OPTIONS**

#### Issues

- 4 Pursuant to section 199 (2) of the Act, ARLA may specify the form of the annual report and matters to be included in the annual report.
- This year the report request has changed and we have completed the report via an online reporting format. In addition to the current year's statistics, we have been asked to provide some statistics from July 2016 to June 2017 as ARLA's intention is to use this data over subsequent years to build a picture of any trends. The material attached in Appendix One, contains the information that was uploaded into the online report.
- Please note that there are differences in statistics providing in the ARLA annual report (Appendix One) and ARLA annual return (Appendix Two). This is because the report refers to licences or certificates "issued" and the return refers to "applications received".

It is unclear that the Act is having a significant impact in our area. Kapiti Coast District Council has chosen not to develop a Local Alcohol Policy given issues and costs that other Councils have faced in attempting to establish a policy. In the Committee's opinion, this has limited the impact of the Act. The most noticeable impact in our area is the implementation of Single Alcohol Areas in supermarkets, but this has also had its own difficulties given the time it is taking for case law to develop.
