**Request for Information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act) (the LGOIMA)**

Thank you for your email of **4 August 2023** requesting the following information:

- 1. Could you please advise (in the 2022/23 year) how much Council has paid to Iwi as part of all consultation processes?***

The Kāpiti Coast District Council (the Council) has a long-standing formal partnership known as Te Whakaminenga o Kāpiti, with the three mana whenua on the Kāpiti Coast, Ātiawa ki Whakarongotai, Ngāti Toa Rangatira and Ngāti Raukawa ki te Tonga through Ngā Hapu o Ōtaki. This partnership guides the Council relationship with iwi.

Te Whakaminenga o Kāpiti Work Plan has an annual budget to support Council consultation and engagement with iwi, and to support the delivery of the annual Te Whakaminenga o Kapiti Work Programme.

Table One below provides details of the Te Whakaminenga o Kāpiti 2022/23 Work Plan expenditure where the expenditure related specifically to supporting Council consultation and engagement with iwi.

The Council has spent \$28,512.00 on cultural training for the 2022/23 financial year.

**3. Also provide details of all other payments that have been paid to Iwi including Koha.**

The Council has paid \$2,800.00 in Koha during the 2022/23 financial year. The Council has also paid \$144,000 to iwi or Council mana whenua representatives for appointments to governance roles during the same period.
