
SAFETY AT PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS





SLOW DOWN

AND BE PREPARED TO STOP!

KEA CROSSINGS are located outside schools and are patrolled before and after school, but they do **NOT have white line** markings (unlike the school patrol zebra crossings).

These crossings only operate when an orange triangular flag is displayed on both sides of the crossing and a 'School Patrol Stop' sign is swung out onto the roadway.

The students and adults involved in school patrols are trained by NZ POLICE SCHOOL EDUCATION OFFICERS.

The 'School Patrol Stop' signs are swung out when there is a gap in the traffic using a set reference point e.g. the white 'diamond' painted on the road, 50 metres from the pedestrian crossing.

All drivers MUST STOP on the white **stop line** painted on the road before the crossing and remain stopped until the **'School Patrol Stop'** signs are swung back in.

If you are in a queue of traffic near a pedestrian crossing, only move onto the crossing if there is enough room for your vehicle to clear it.
