Request for Information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act) (the LGOIMA)

Thank you for your email of **8 February 2024** requesting the following information:

Total number of Earthquake prone buildings in Kāpiti Coast territorial authority, deadlines, expired notices, number of heritage buildings, apartment buildings council-owned buildings

Officers checked our records and the national earthquake prone building register. They confirmed that there are currently 33 earthquake prone buildings in the Kāpiti Coast District. All these notices expire in 2033 and 2034.

They also advised none of the current earthquake prone buildings have expired notices and none of the buildings are apartment buildings. Nine of the current earthquake prone buildings are owned by Council. None of the earthquake prone buildings are heritage buildings.
