2		Mar 2019	Future Waikanae Beach Vision and Action Plan	<p>Environment Court mediation regarding the Waikanae Olde Beach PDP appeal was held on 30 April 2018. A draft variation for the Old Beach area, to introduce the Beach Residential Zone, was considered by the Strategy & Policy Committee on 21 March, which granted approval to publicly notify. The appeal was subsequently withdrawn.</p> <p>It is intended to publicly notify the variation in May/June 2019.</p>
3		2033	Town Centres	<p>Upgrade to Mahara Place:</p> <p>Improvement work in Mahara Place continues to progress well and is tracking to be completed late July 2019.</p> <p><i>Where we're up to</i></p> <p>Over the past month we've done a lot of the concrete work, we've started installing timber decking and the garden areas are taking shape. We've removed pavers and we've started to remove the canopy around the Library and Mahara Gallery.</p> <p><i>Supporting businesses</i></p> <p>Our programme of monthly events to encourage people into Mahara Place to support the businesses during construction is well underway.</p> <p>The April "Why I love Waikanae" letter writing competition attracted lots of entries and we've made a wall panel for Mahara Place showcasing some of the best letters. The three winners of the ipads were delighted and we got some great media coverage and engagement on our Facebook page.</p> <p>The Creative Crafts Day held this month also attracted a good number of attendees and we received some really positive feedback with</p>

It was a great initiative to get people into Mahara Place and show off some of the businesses and local crafts people.</p> <p>On 13 June we're holding a Winter Gardening day led by local gardening legend Kath Irvine. This is a chance for people to learn about winter planting, mulching and maintenance. She'll be joined by Council gardener Julie Harris and by the Waikanae Library staff with their seed bank and origami seed pots. 6		June 2019?	Transpower removal of trees from Waikanae Park	<p>Transpower have advised that major works are scheduled for 2019, but have not provided a work programme. The Board will be advised of any proposed tree removals.</p>
