Submitters can comment on all or specific proposals for a speed limit change. Changes are proposed on 36 roads in ten areas throughout Kāpiti. Following feedback during the engagement phase we have added more detail on the rationale for each of the proposed changes into the submission document, including safety and environmental aspects. For speed change proposals in Poplar Ave we have included a second option for a length of road through the village shops area.
