Urgent request for Information under the Local Government and Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act)

Thank you for your email of 21 October 2022 requesting the following information:

All correspondence relating to the Otaki Civic theatre in the past year from all interested parties in leasing this venue.

Please find attached the information you requested.

Please note, the personal details of other parties has been withheld from this information. The decision to withhold this information is made under section 7(2)(a) of the LGOIMA which allows for Council to withhold information in order to protect the privacy of natural persons, including that of deceased natural persons.

In the Council's view the reasons for withholding these details are not outweighed by public interest considerations in section 7(1) favouring their release.

other community groups to access year-round. We'd also run a full programme of classes, cinema and shows - a win-win for our community.



I've looked at booking the Ōtaki Civic Theatre. I was hoping to book a music event later this year in Ōtaki. But iv'e decided to do it in Wellington instead.

The theatre contact for bookings has been very helpful. However, I note that making a booking has a number of hurdles - which I would like, if possible, to support smoothing out.

Firstly:

It would help to know if the lease has any written mention of facilitating others to use the theatre. I'm also hoping to find data on current theatre use (seats sold) over recent years. Possibly only from the Otaki players themselves.

It may well be that the theatre is already serving the community well enough, and I mean no disrespect to those who have kept the theatre going over the years.
