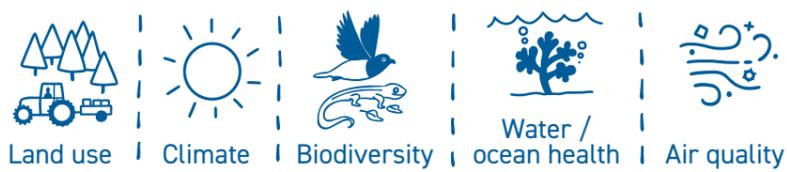


SUPPORTING YOUR HEALTH ON THE KĀPITI COAST

There are concerns about the availability of primary and urgent and emergency care services on the coast, as well as access to regional hospitals and specialist care.

What they do

When additional support or specialist services are needed.

Early intervention and treatment. Often your first port of call when you have a health concern.

Prevents illness and disease, protects population health, and promotes wellbeing/hauora, including through healthy environments.

Who delivers these services

Hospital-based services, services in the community that require a referral, private specialist services.

General Practitioners (GPs), pharmacists, nurses, midwives, allied health providers.

Primary care (prevention eg vaccinations and early intervention); the Council (eg environmental health, urban planning, community facilities); community and NGOs (health promotion and support services); National Public Health Service (eg public nursing, infectious disease control, screening).
