In any case with a diverse population we are no longer predominantly a European/Christian society so it's becoming hard to justify holidays based on Christianity. Anyway, Easter was of course originally a festival celebrating the arrival of spring, and is named for the goddess of spring (hence the rabbits, eggs) and was taken over by the early church, so doesn't work for us in the southern hemisphere on several levels.

Recommendation

Surely the whole point of holidays is to provide rejuvenation and re-creation from the busy humdrum of work-a-day life.
