Our current approach

Our current policy:

- Identifies nine sites for responsible camping
- Restricts the number of vehicles, duration, and allows self-contained vehicles only
- The policy differs to the Freedom Camping Act 2011 (FCA)
- Has a strong focus on education to manage freedom camping.



The need for review

Changing context:

- 2023 legislation has introduced a certified self-contained vehicles requirement – transitioning by mid-2025.
- Increasing levels of activity
- Creating pressures and issues, but also opportunities
- Consideration of bylaw for additional powers
- ➤ The FCA has also been amended to ensure people experiencing homelessness aren't unfairly penalised.

Our evidence gathering

We have reviewed and analysed:

- Changes to the Freedom Camping Act
- Pre- and post-covid tourism data (including camping visitors)
- Freedom camping visitor survey (January-June 2023)
- Service Requests 2018-2024
- Compliance monitoring data 2018-2024
- Vision Kāpiti feedback
- Freedom camping fit with our other plans/bylaws
- What other Councils are doing
- Initial stock take of our land with a freedom camping lens

Our stakeholder early-engagement

- Iwi partners on review and need for stock take
- Council-affected teams i.e. Parks, Roading, Regulatory
- Other land authorities to determine their approaches
- Tourism/economic development associations
- New Zealand Motor Caravan Association (NZMCA) regarding their goals & priorities
- KiwiCamp/KiwiCash re what they can provide
- Other Councils on their issues and management of them
- Camping apps regarding supporting information
