Request for Information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act) (the LGOIMA)

Thank you for your email of **20 September 2023** requesting the following information:

As I understand it KCDC owns/holds the work by Jacobs referenced in your answer and the rating database.

Can you therefore please provide me under the LGOIMA with the metadata/schema for the these two databases, sufficient to cover the data necessary to link the CV/LVs of Kapiti properties with their various statuses in terms of my second question in my earlier request.

To clarify, KCDC does not hold metadata/schema that links CV/LVs of Kapiti properties with the various statuses relating to hazard susceptibility. I can confirm that Jacobs has not created a database linking this information. However, I am able to provide you with:

- Mapping of areas susceptible to current and future coastal erosion and inundation under various potential magnitudes of sea-level rise over 30, 50, and 100 years has been created. This mapping is available at: <u>Takutai Kāpiti Coastal Hazard</u> Susceptibility Assessment (kapiticoast.govt.nz).
- Data on the capital and land values of all individual properties within the district. Please find in this information in the attached excel spreadsheet.

Under section 17(g)(i) of the LGOIMA, I am required to note that I must decline part of your request as the information you have directly requested is not held by the local authority and the person dealing with the request has no grounds for believing that the information is either held by another local authority or a department or Minister of the Crown or organisation; or connected more closely with the functions of another local authority, or a department or Minister of the Crown or organisation.
