A verbal update will be provided at the meeting.</p>

Attendees were asked to provide feedback by the end of January 2015.</p> <p>The Police reported that Ruapehu Street was not considered a high speed area and only one ticket had been issued in the last 12 months. Any further feedback received will be provided to the Board meeting of 31 March 2015.</p> <p>The only feedback received has been from Kapiti Cycling. Their critique is pedestrian and cycle focussed and will be taken into consideration. They are requesting more widespread consultation is made before any decisions are made.</p>

The first step is to get approval from the Community Board; the second is to get this accepted by the Regulatory Management Committee.</p> <p>A further study and report will need to be tabled to the Community Board for approval for any amended parking restrictions at this location.</p> <p>August 2014 Originally trying to get the Kapiti Road, Otaihanga area, and Raumati South Village speed limits all tabled at the June meeting but due to the size of the report this was reduced to Kapiti Road only. Since then there has also been feedback from NZTA who were not happy with our Consultant's speed limit reports.</p> <p>OPUS will review the reports and once robust they will be tabled at PRCB. They will be seeking approval for a 30km/h limit on Poplar Ave (no.s 24 – 46), 1 – 9 Renown Road, and covering the junctions with Glen Road and Tennis Court Rd, together with a raised pedestrian crossing and any necessary parking restriction changes.</p> <p>December 2014 The Opus report has been completed and will be presented to the 17 February meeting.</p> <p>March 2015 All speed limit work is on hold until the new Speed Limit Bylaw is in place. This is not expected to be operative until September 2015.</p>	To allow time for consultation and approvals the physical construction process has been moved out to 2014/15

18 February 2014	PRCB meeting	Realm Drive traffic issues	<p>April 2015 Construction on the new pedestrian ramps and build-outs commenced on 22 April and are expected to be completed by end of May, weather permitting. The design was modified after feedback was received from Kapiti Cycling, which resulted in a minor delay to the works being completed.</p> <p>The foundation sockets for the new signs on Guildford Drive and Mazengarb Drive are programmed to be concreted into the ground on 4/5 May. They will be given 2-3 days to harden up, after which the posts will be slid into the sockets and both signs bolted up.</p>	June 2014	Six months after work completed

An approach to managing them must be decided.	<p>Council's Leisure & Open Space Asset Manager discussed the matter with Greater Wellington Regional Council. They advise their Pest Management Plan is subject to the Ministry of Primary Industry providing a national policy on the matter, which should occur in early 2015.</p> <p>February 2015 GWRC confirm the National Policy Direction from the Ministry of Primary Industries is expected by mid-2015, after which GWRC will begin a review of their Regional Pest Management Plan. At the time of the review they will consider the request for inclusion of Canada geese in that Plan.</p> <p>April 2015 This matter was included in the Council's submission to GWRC's Long Term Plan which was sent on 20 April.</p>	??
