However, the majority of the vegetation that is encroaching onto the road berm is planted in Council road reserve. The signage provides for no parking between 8.30am – 9.15am in the morning and 2.30pm to 3.30pm in the afternoon. This was part of the minor works improvements as advised to the Community Board and completed in December 2018.</p> <p>The drop off/Pick Up zone was requested by the School Principal in conjunction with the Police School Community Officer and was part of the road safety improvements to Arnold Grove that has received unanimous approval from the parents, staff and local community as a major improvement over the old layout.</p> <p>Council’s Transport Safety Coordinator visited Kena Kena School to help parents and caregivers etc. to use the Drop off/Pick up zone correctly. Disability car parks are located within the school grounds located near the school office, accessed via the Donovan Road main entrance.</p> <p>For two of the five car parks to be designated as Mother and Baby with blue synthite on the car parks would be further considered if a request was made by the school and/or school parents.
