

Keep our beaches beautiful

Follow the rules:

- Don't remove more sand, stones or driftwood than you can carry.
- Respect the dunes – don't walk, ride or drive in these restricted access areas.
- Keep dogs under control at all times to protect wildlife, and prevent nuisance to others.
- Use signposted beach accessways.

More information on vehicles on the beach

- Our local roads have many pedestrian access points where you can park and easily walk to your favourite beach spots. Don't drive where it's not permitted – it compromises the safety and enjoyment of others on our beaches.
- If you're driving in a vehicle permitted area (see map inside), always follow the speed restrictions (20km/hr).
- Other rules restrict motor vehicles in the Coastal Marine Area and Waikanae Estuary Scientific Reserve. These rules protect our natural coastal environment, flora and fauna, and are managed by the Greater Wellington Regional Council and the Department of Conservation. For information see:

Vehicles on the beach

Vehicles:

- Vehicles are only allowed on the beach in permitted driving and boat launching areas (🚗 and 🚤 on the map).
- Vehicles should not exceed 10km/h on vehicle accessways.
- Vehicles should not exceed 20km/h in permitted driving areas.
- Vehicles are banned on pedestrian beach accessways, dune areas, and where coastal protection works are under way.

Anyone not complying with these rules is liable to a fine.

Two-wheeled motorbikes (on or off road) are banned from all beach areas.

Parking:

- Vehicles may park in beach driving areas (🚗 on the map).
- Where driving is not permitted (🚫🚗 on the map):
 - vehicles launching or retrieving boats can park in authorised boat launching areas
 - vehicles displaying a current Mobility Parking permit can park in the authorised boat launching areas at Kāpiti and Waikanae Boating Clubs (♿️🚗 on the map).

Anyone not complying with these rules is liable to a fine of \$40.
