Request for Information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act) (the LGOIMA)

Thank you for your email of **18 May 2024** requesting the following information:

Te Horo Hall is identified as a heritage building within the Kapiti Coast Operative District Plan. Could you please provide all information relating to this building being included as a heritage building in the District Plan. I believe it was before 2011 (probably around early 2000's). I also believe the heritage status was proposed by the then (now defunct) Kapiti Historical Society to help protect the building from an uncertain future. (a new KHS in 2018 has since been formed)

I would like to see all correspondence with regards to the application to have the Te Horo Hall included as a heritage building, including all the reasons for it being deemed a heritage building.

Te Horo Hall with heritage register B110 was nominated and included into the heritage register through Plan Change 32B of the District Plan in 2006. We have attached the following documents in response to your question:

- Plan Change 32B section 32 Report
- Summary of submissions Plan Change 32B
- Plan Change 32B Hearing report heritage register update
- Public notice of decision Plan Change 32B
