<p>School Travel Planning</p>			<p><u>School Travel Plan Implementation</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="635 439 1310 539">– <i>Paraparaumu School</i>: Student School Travel Plan working group running a term 3 active travel promotion (until recent arson attack on school). <li data-bbox="635 573 1262 734">– <i>Kāpiti School</i>: Working with a Paraparaumu Town Centre Design Group, mapping their current travel and activities within the town centre and then developing their ideas for the future. <li data-bbox="635 775 1310 1043">– <i>Kenakena School</i>: The student Council organised an “Active August” week from 11 to 15 August. Working with 12 senior students on road safety outside their school. They are conducting observations of parking behaviour and pedestrian counts before and after school. They are then following this up with speed radar gun surveys. <li data-bbox="635 1077 1310 1178">– <i>Paraparaumu Beach School</i>: Meeting with Police and School staff to have a coordinated response to deal with parking behaviour on Gray Avenue. <li data-bbox="635 1211 1262 1312">– <i>Raumati South School</i>: Sixty four Year 5 students involved in a grade 2 (on road) cycle skills programme. <li data-bbox="635 1346 1286 1447">– <i>Te Ra Waldof School</i>: Grade 1 cycle skills programme completed with all senior students. Kiss and Drop off area installed on Matai Road. <li data-bbox="635 1480 1310 1984">– <u>School Travel Plan Survey results</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="679 1514 1310 1682">• <i>Paekākāriki School</i> re-survey completed in early May, even with two days of rain and two with high winds only 31% (up from 29%) of students driven to School in the family car. Nearly 50% of children walk to School. <li data-bbox="679 1693 1310 1850">• <i>Paraparaumu Beach School</i> re-survey completed in late March, only 43% (down from 45%) of children driven to School in the family car. Scooting is the predominant active travel choice at nearly 30%. <li data-bbox="679 1861 1310 1984">• <i>Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Te Rito</i> re-survey completed early March, 62% of tamariki driven to Kura in the family car. Resource Consents			<p><u>Appeals</u></p> <p>There are currently no Appeals to the Environment Court.</p> <p>Notified Applications:</p> <p><u>Advertising Billboard</u></p> <p>An application to install a two-sided advertising billboard on Cnr Elizabeth Street and SH1, Waikanae, was publicly notified on 12 June 2014 and notice was served on surrounding properties. Submissions closed on 10 July 2014. 15 submissions have been received – all oppose the application. The application is now on-hold while the applicant consults with the land owner (KiwiRail).</p> <p><u>Early Childhood Centre</u></p> <p>An application to establish and operate a new early childhood centre at 17 Alexander Road, Raumati Beach is being processed on a limited notified basis. Notice of the application has been served on one adjoining property – 19 Alexander Road. The submission period closes on 10 September 2014.</p> <p><u>M2PP Alteration to Designation</u></p> <p>Council received an application for a Notice of Requirement for a minor alteration to the MacKays to Peka Peka Designation involving several Chitton Drive and one Mazengarb Road property. The application has been processed by way of limited notification with notice served on ten properties. Notice was served on 14/02/2014. The submission period closed 14/03/2014. Following the closure of the submission period a report was prepared and a hearing held on 6/6/2014. The Council does not have decision making powers on the application, but it made a recommendation to the requiring authority to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Confirm the requirement with modifications. 	

		<p>The requiring authority accepted the Council's recommendation and notice of the requiring authority's decision was sent to all parties potentially affected advising them that they had 15 working days to decide if they wish to lodge an appeal with the Environment Court. No appeals were lodged and the alteration is now finalised.</p> <p><u>Big Mac Slabs Furniture - 289 Mazengarb Road</u></p> <p>The application seeks consent to establish and operate an Industrial activity and erect 2 dwellings in the rural zone. The application was notified to the local community considered to be potentially affected.</p> <p>17 submissions were received, 4 in support and 13 in opposition. The next step is to organise a hearing which is likely to take place late September/early October.</p> <p><u>Waikanae North School at 53 State Highway 1</u></p> <p>Hearing Commissioners at a hearing held on Wednesday 4 June 2014 confirmed the Notice of Requirement to designate a site for Educational purposes to establish a primary school and early childhood centre at 53 State Highway 1, Waikanae subject to conditions. Council is awaiting a response from the Ministry of Education (Requiring Authority) to accept or reject the recommended conditions.</p>	
Collmog Bridge		<p>Following the decision reached at the last Regulatory Management Committee meeting, officers have reissued section 124 notices with an expiry date of 31 May 2014. We have also issued infringement notices following the non-compliance with the section 124 notice that expired on 29 November 2013. We have recently received additional information and the consent is progressing.</p>
