Request for Official Information responded to under the Local Government and Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA) – reference: 8235262 (OIR: 2021-241)

I refer to your information request we received on 17 April 2021 for the following:

A copy of a current document Kapiti Coast District Council use to define where parking within 6 Meters of a corner actually starts. (Perhaps an extract from training material for your wardens).

There are a number of ways in which it could be calculated where the 6 metre position starts (potentially from the end of the corner radius or projections of corner radii to a point for example) and I seek a document that you use that defines this please. If available can you, please advise the source of the measurement methodology.

Our Council does not have a policy or practice document but rather are guided by NZTA/Waka Kotahi practice guidelines. NZTA advice on their website (which is also reflected in enabling legislation and codes) is that parking is not permitted on, or closer than 6 meters to, an intersection, unless there are parking spaces or a notice telling you that you can park there.

We do take a common sense approach when we respond to a complaint of this nature.
