Introduction

The local churches listed above would like to make a submission to Council opposing the proposal to adopt an Easter Sunday shop trading policy, with reasons as follows.

1. Easter Sunday is regarded as a special day by many Kapiti residents and others.

Easter Sunday is regarded as a special day by many New Zealanders, including, but not limited to, those who identify themselves as Christians. It is the day when Christians all over the world take part in worship and prayer in remembrance of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. For many also, whether identifying as Christians or not, it is a special day of rest and relaxation.

2. More Kapiti residents are of Christian religious affiliation than any other religious affiliation

We note that according to the 2013 census, 22,440 people marked themselves as Christian, with a further 267 who marked themselves as "Maori Christian". This was out of a total of 45,888 of those who chose to answer the question. In other words the percentage Christian of those who chose to answer was almost half the total respondents (49.5%), or 45.7% of the total Kapiti population. This compared with 20,490 people who marked themselves as having "no religion". The next highest religion was Buddhism, with just 393 adherents. (Spreadsheet of census results attached.)

On the basis of these figures we believe that it is reasonable to assume that the majority of residents would prefer to retain Easter Sunday as a special national day, which is also regarded as special by many people of other religions and viewpoints.

3. Abolition of restriction of Easter Sunday trading would discriminate against retail workers.

According to union information there are only now 3 ½ days per year when retail workers are guaranteed a day off. We believe that leisure time is the right of every New Zealander, and would be resistant to add one more pressure to families who want to spend time with their children.

4. Central government protections for workers affected by this legislation are inadequate.

We are aware the legislation would give opportunities for staff to decline work "with no reason necessary". However, it seems possible that "power relations" in the workplace may render this promise unreliable. Many workers may not be fully aware of their entitlements regarding the day off. Although theoretically retailers have a choice, this is not always as straightforward as it may appear, as some employees are not always easily replaced. Workers on a 90-day trial agreement who refuse to work could be at risk of dismissal. As Easter Sunday is not a public holiday, there is no guarantee even of extra pay.

5. Public policy should encourage families to spend quality and quantity time together

At a time when New Zealand experienced 606 suicides last year, extreme care should be taken to make sure public policy should pay due regard to the welfare of all New Zealanders. A recent study by the Department of Statistics (New Zealand General Social Survey (NZGSS) 2014) found that almost 1 in 3 people (31 percent) who lived with their spouse or partner, and 2 in 5 (40 percent) of those who lived apart from their spouse or partner, felt they didn't spend enough quality time with them.

The figure was approximately the same in regard to spending time with children. One-third (31 percent) of parents felt they didn't have enough quality time with children. These proportions were the same for couple-with-children or one-parent-with-children families.

Research overseas shows that family time is very important to children and young people. For example, a study published in the US Journal of Family Issues, led by Brown University sociologist Gregory Elliott, shows that adolescents who believe they matter to their families are less likely to threaten or engage in violence against family members.

The concept of "mattering" is that an individual believes they make a difference in the world around them. According to the study, mattering is composed of three factors – awareness, importance, and reliance. Do others know you exist? Do they invest time and resources in you? Do they look to you as a resource? Elliott asserts that mattering is the fundamental motivation in human beings.

The data for this analysis comes from telephone interviews with a sample of 2,004 adolescents, age 11-18, as part of the 2000 Youth Risk Behavior Survey. Controlling for age, gender, race, religiosity, and family socioeconomic structure and size, the findings reveal that failing to matter to one's family increases the probability of violence, whereas a strong feeling of mattering is likely to protect the adolescent from engaging in violent behavior toward a family member. ¹

In our opinion, adequate time with family is a core need in today's society and it therefore seems inadvisable to load just one more pressure on retail workers and their families, who would clearly benefit from spending quality time together.

Conclusion

The shift to 24/7 trading and 24/7 employment has not increased the amount of money to be spent in retail outlets, just the number of hours across which retail businesses compete. But it has increased the hours days on which people are expected to work, at the same time fragmenting jobs into part-time and casual employment to cover those hours. The outcome is not just shifts at work but shifts at home, as many parents try to juggle hours to be with their children (as by law) let alone with each other. In most jobs, penal rates for 'unsociable hours' are a thing of the past, except for the time-and-a-half and time off in lieu by law for certain special public holidays, such as Easter. There are now very few times at which friends and extended families can get together, because of 24/7 work commitments. And the idea that one should be 'free' to trade away public holiday entitlements in employment contracts shows complete lack of understanding about the powerless of most job-seekers in an economy run at 6% unemployment. Yet there is nothing more delightful about the NZ way of life than to see the way the whole country relaxes and enjoys family life at the beach or picnicking in public parks and local music events on public holidays like Easter weekend. It is just lovely to see everyone, from all our differing communities, out together enjoying themselves. This is the heart of life on the Kapiti coast, but it is people and families, not business opportunities, that are important. We should have more public holidays like Easter, not fewer. Traditional religious celebration days for Christians may be less important to many Pakeha New Zealanders these day – but where are the public holidays for other religious traditions and communities? And what about the days that celebrate public life together - like Labour Day, Anzac Day and the regional anniversary days that we all look forward to. We have far fewer public holidays than many European countries - we should have more of these days off together, not less, and they should be protected by law from the encroachment of work obligations. Submission by R J Ewen to Kapiti District Council on its proposed Easter Sunday Shop Trading Policy.

After reading the Council's Statement of Proposal, my understanding of Clause 10 on the unnumbered third page is that any policy on Easter Sunday shop trading that the Council may adopt, can only enable trading on Easter Sunday; it cannot have a policy of not allowing trading. Therefore, I ask that the Council keeps the status quo, i.e., decides not to have a policy

I find it ironic that while central government over the years has criticised local authorities for being 'local' in their bylaws and regulations, resulting in variations around the country, it has now deliberately created the potential for such variation. It appears that it has done this mainly to avoid having to make the decision itself.

Clause 3 of the Statement states the 3½ days on which most shops have to remain closed. Turning it around the other way, the public has the opportunity to shop on 361½ days out of 365 each year. I do not accept that the limitation on Easter Sunday shopping has caused the general public major inconvenience compared to the benefit for many workers to enjoy a work-free day with their families, Most people readily organise their shopping to fit in with the other aspects of their life, and Easter Sunday has been just such an event. Indeed, New Zealand's older citizens have clear memories of the days when shopping was possible only on weekdays, and yet we still managed to buy all our needs and, I might add, without the help of 24/7 advertising.

However, those benefits of work-free weekends when workers could spend precious time with their families have been progressively reduced. We must recognise that in NZ, Chambers of Commerce, retail organisations and businesses want every opportunity possible to trade; ideally for them this would be 365 days a year. There has been this regular pressure to chip away at the very last vestiges of trading-free days in NZ. The question has become one of deciding where to hold the line. I am certain that if Easter Sunday is allowed to become just another shopping day, in a few years, the same arguments will be advanced to allow the same unlimited trading on Good Friday and who knows, eventually Christmas Day and the non-commercial part of Anzac Day. People's lives should be about more than just being consumers; they need time for rest and recreation, to spend time with family, opportunities to pursue other interests.

Business interests talk about freedom of choice and convenience, but I submit that fundamentally they are driven by their desire to seize any opportunity to maximise turnover even if it is at the expense of quality of life. Shopping is an adjunct to life not a way of life itself. I have a concern that if a policy is adopted, that there will be pressure, both subtle and overt, on employees to work on Easter Sunday, in spite of the provisions of the Shop Trading Act

I am aware that these kinds of holidays began as religious celebrations and that there is an argument that as 42% of New Zealander have no religious affiliation, any recognition of that aspect is not warranted. Out of interest, I looked up the public holidays of a number of European countries that could be said to be similar to NZ, separating those holidays into what I termed secular and religious public holidays. I omitted the southern European countries as they seem more overtly religious than the others. Here is what I found:

I have been in some of these countries on a day when one of their religious public holidays occurs and I found their observance the same as our own Easter Sunday, i.e. only certain types of business were permitted to trade. Those countries' peoples have no difficulty with this: they see it as something that goes with that day, and from my observation, make the most of having a work-free, family day.

For the reasons given above, I urge Members of the Council to follow the lead of the Porirua and Hutt City Councils and not adopt a policy on Easter Sunday Trading.
