Request for Official Information responded to under the Local Government and Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA) – reference: OIR 2122-177

I refer to your information request we received on 19 January 2022 for the following:

Any internal communications regarding pausing, delaying or terminating work on new or existing water infrastructure projects due to the Three Waters Reform Programme since January 2021.

Council response regarding your request

As regards your telephonic enquiry about the Government's Three Waters Reform programme, it is a big deal, and Councillors, as your elected representatives met on Thursday, 30 September to form an initial view to feedback to the Government, no decisions to opt-in or out are being made at this stage. As a Council, we understand that our community has a vested interest in how our three waters services are delivered in the future, and we're committed to sharing information with you as we receive it.
