That the Paraparaumu/Raumati Community Board make a submission to the upcoming review of the Greater Wellington Regional Council's Parks Network Plan endorsing the recommendation made by Kapiti Coast District Council officers regarding the location of poplar trees to be planted on Poplar Avenue, and that Council notes this resolution.

That the Paraparaumu/Raumati Community Board once again request that staff give urgent priority to Poplar Avenue, from the Queen Elizabeth Park cycleway and westwards, for the purposes of the speed limit review while working with the Raumati South Residents Association, and that Council notes this resolution.
