Request for Information under the Local Government and Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act)

Thank you for your email of 2 November 2022 requesting the following information:

I emailed you about the Lorna Irene Drive playground on 2 November. It's been 12 working days since my previous message. The Official Information Act stipulates you have 20 working days to respond to my query - that's Tuesday 29 November.

FYI - those questions I asked that I'd like answered please:

1. Can you please show me how the feedback received was reflected into the designs and play equipment incorporated in the design of the Lorna Irene play area.

Attached as Appendix One is a copy of the Have Your Say survey results and the submissions provided through the Have Your Say Ideas Board which ran from 1 June – 12 July 2021. Along with the feedback through the online platform, we also received feedback via paper forms and through our in-person 'Korero and coffee' events. The consultation for the Lorna Irene Drive Reserve playground was run alongside the revamping projects for the Milne Drive and Shotover Grove Reserve playgrounds, both of these projects target differing age groups.

Overall, feedback for the Lorna Irene Drive Reserve playground was that people liked the style of equipment that was at the playground and that the age range met the needs of most local families. The concept of an all-abilities playground was raised and supported through the survey and during wider conversations. The funds available for this project allowed us to provide the only all-abilities playground in Kāpiti.

2. I would like to see the allowances made for older children - specifically, adventure play and challenge

As the majority of feedback from our consultation was for the younger to middle age group, this was reflected in the design. We have 49 playgrounds across our district with each servicing different age ranges. If you would like to see what other parks have to offer, visit https://www.kapiticoast.govt.nz/findapark.

But we also recognise that play is more than playgrounds. Next year we will be starting a State of Play survey where we go into schools to with a neighbourhood lens, including how kids travel to school, where they like to play, favourite way to play and everything in between. I can talk in more detail about this concept which is led by SportNZ if you would like to know more. This will help support projects and other opportunities that support play in our neighbourhood spaces.

3. Can you please provide a plan of what is going to be built - not that image from the FB story, a plan.












How often do you visit Lorna Irene Drive Reserve?


