## About preparing a further submission on a proposed plan change

### You must use the prescribed form

- [Clause 8](#), Schedule 1 of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) requires further submissions to be on the prescribed form.
- The prescribed form is set out in [Form 6](#), Schedule 1 of the Resource Management (Forms, Fees, and Procedure) Regulations 2003.
- This template is based on Form 6. While you do not have to use this template, your submission must be in accordance with Form 6.

### Certain persons may make further submissions

If humans are going to survive a global temperature increase of even 1.5°C, we need to plant and conserve large native trees, for carbon sequestration, for human well-being, to provide a habitat for native creatures and for shade against UV, to protect people from skin cancer. I also support the restoration and replanting of wetlands on the Kapiti Coast, including kahikatea planting. I am a member of Forest and Bird and Low Carbon Kapiti.
