CAMPE ESTATE GRANTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

The Campe Estate Subcommittee needs to consider the recommendations from the Paekākāriki Community Board in relation to the grants from the Campe Estate.

DELEGATIONS

- The Campe Estate Subcommittee administers the Campe Estate funds deriving from the sale of 6 Robertson Road, Paekākāriki, bequeathed to the Council in 1991 as a Gift of Special Trust. The conditions are:
 - That the Council uses the property and/or the income from it for charitable purposes which will benefit the people of Paekākāriki township;
 - That the Council uses the property for the benefit of the youth of Paekākāriki.

The Subcommittee also administers the funds deriving from the interest of the Arthur Thomas Clark Trust, for the benefit of the residents of the Paekākāriki residents. Decisions about allocations under the two funds are made concurrently.

BACKGROUND

At the Paekākāriki Community Board meeting on 16 May 2017, the Board considered report IS-17-191 and made the following recommendations:

That the the Campe Estate Trustees grant the sum of \$300.00 to Paekākāriki Starstormers Junior Roller Derby League to purchase team uniforms for regional competitions

That the the Campe Estate Trustees grant the sum of \$352.00 to Paekākāriki School to purchase new library books.

That the the Campe Estate Trustees grant the sum of \$393.00 to the Paekākāriki Scout Group to purchase a replacement climbing equipment.

That the the Campe Estate Trustees grant the sum of \$400.00 to Mary Gow to assist with the costs of running two childrens musical instrument workshops in June 2017.

That the the Campe Estate Trustees grant the sum of \$700.00 to The Pineapple Project to fund its 'Star in a Short Film' holiday programme.

CONSIDERATIONS

Issues and options

- The process for grant applications from the Campe Estate is that the Paekākāriki Community Board first consider the applications to ensure that they meet the agreed criteria and then makes recommendations to the Campe Estate Subcommittee.
- The applications meet the criteria for the Campe Estate grants ie. from organisations that provide services which support the people of Paekākāriki with an emphasis on youth.

Financial Considerations

The Council's interest earning special funds and reserves accrue interest at a rate of the Official Cash Rate less 0.1 percent. The Council intends to review its current practice to identify any opportunities to maximise interest earned, where applicable.

CRITERIA FOR CAMPE ESTATE COMMUNITY GRANTS

The Paekākāriki Community Board will receive the applications and make recommendations to the Campe Estate Subcommittee who will consider the recommendations and administer the distribution of the grants.

The criteria for applications are:

- 1. Applications with a focus on people aged under 25 years will be considered a priority;
- 2. Applications will be accepted from organisations that provide services which benefit the people, especially the young people of Paekākāriki;
- 3. Applications will be accepted from individuals provided there are tangible benefits to the Paekākāriki area;
- 4. Applications will include an outline of the expected benefits of any grant to the applicant, the organisation and the Paekākāriki community;
- 5. Applicants will only receive one grant per financial year;
- 6. Successful applicants will provide a report to the Community Board for the information of the Campe Estate Trustees on the uses of the funding and an account of the benefits which have accrued to the Paekākāriki community, the individual and/or the group.

WHY DO YOU NEED THIS FUNDING? (Please attach further information that will help your application)

The Paekakariki Scout Group has a focus on leadership and outdoor skills and caters for 90 local tamariki and rangitahi aged between 5 and 16. We have a special fit for purpose climbing rope, which is nearing the end of its useful (safe) life and needs to replaced. A Campe Estate grant will allow us to buy a new 60 metre climbing rope and slings. Our old/current climbing rope can then be repurposed into a series of shorter ropes to support our wider outdoor programme including a range of rope and knot based activities such as raft building, bivouacs, zip lines, towers and structures, swings etc.

WHEN DO YOU NEED IT (START DATE)?: Before spring and the good weather.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTED BENEFITS TO YOU (THE APPLICANT)?

A new dedicated climbing rope and slings will enable us to continue to safely deliver our adventure and outdoor programme. The repurposing of our current end of life climbing rope will replenish our ropes supplies and allow us to continue to offer a diverse range of rope and knot based activities that provide challenge for the over 80 Paekakariki tamariki that attend the scout Group.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTED BENEFITS TO THE PAEKĀKĀRIKI AREA?

We build individual skills based on challenge and adventure that benefit the village now and in the future. Our activities add vibrancy to the village, including regular car washes, our annual Quiz night and Garage Sale and the upcoming midwinter swim. We support important Village events such as the recent Anzac Day ceremony, where approximately 50 tamariki and leaders attended, as well as undertaking beach clean ups and helping at tree plantings etc.

WHY DO YOU NEED THIS FUNDING? (Please attach further information that will help your application) We are running a community holiday programme called 'Star in a Short Film' in the upcoming July holidays. The film is going to be written by local woman Ema Pomare, directed and produced by Julia Truscott and edited by local talented teenager Edison Amery-Zwartz. A large part of the creative work will be done by the young participants (8-13 years) including coming up with shots to create a particular emotion, makeup, costume, set and location dressing and more. The film is going to be shot in the first week of the holidays with St Peter's Hall basecamp. Edison will then edit it in the second week of the holidays and the film will be premiered at St Peter's Hall for the participants and wider public on July 30th. After that it will be available to view online forever and a day. We would love to have the costs of hall hire covered as we only received half of what we asked for from Creative Communities so we are needing a bit more help to get the project on its feet. The theme of the film so far is 'does what we believe shape what we see' and 'does what we see shape what we believe?' As film is a visual medium we want to hone the childrens' skills in image making and thinking metaphorically and get them to show ideas rather than tell them.

WHEN DO YOU NEED IT (START DATE)?: July 10th is when the programme starts but we need to pay for hall hire well before then.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTED BENEFITS TO YOU (THE APPLICANT)? I will benefit from gaining more experience facilitating young people to make films. We have made two short films before with tamariki from Paekakariki: 'Camp McKay' and 'The Message' the latter was written by Ema Pomare and edited by Edison Amery-Zwartz and they can be viewed respectively here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TFt5_RJK3I4&t=34s

Ema will also benefit from having the opportunity to hone her writing skills and Edison will benefit also from another chance to explore his talent for editing.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTED BENEFITS TO THE PAEKĀKĀRIKI AREA?

Obviously offering a week long holiday programme is of great benefit to children and parents alike in the area. Also producing a film that has loads of local references and themes is of immense value to

the wider community as it offers people a mirror on their lives and celebrates the beautiful place we call home. Making a film is a challenging process but the reward is we have something to watch and enjoy for posterity. The film-making itself allows participants to learn many technical and life skills which are transferable to other areas. There will also be some cameo roles for adults in the film as we have found mixing different ages together on a project has many benefits and the opportunities for parents to work with their children in a creative way are few and far between. However, the stars of this show will be the youngsters!
