Submission

There are currently three significant developments in this immediate area:

- 18 ha Mansell Family site

- 12.65 ha site in this submission

- 8.15 ha site (for sale) that adjoins the land in this submission

The transport effects from the development of each site are being treated in isolation. This is an entirely unsatisfactory situation.

Our community needs a plan for the Otaihanga local roading network that addresses the transport effects from current and potential future developments as Otaihanga is migrated from a semi-rural community to an urban community.

The following list is indicative of the enhancements that are needed in such a transport plan. It is not intended to be exhaustive.

- 1. Reduce the speed limit to 50kph for the entire length of Ratanui Road and Otaihanga Road. Reasons: Safety. Consistency.
- 2. Install "no stopping" yellow lines on Ratanui Road outside the pre-school/nursery and the proposed junction to the new retirement village. It should be a requirement that pick up and drop off should occur within the boundaries of those businesses. Reasons: Safety. Maintain traffic flow.
- 3. Address the ongoing, perpetual, very poor condition of the road surface over the railway level crossing on Otaihanga Road. Reason: Safety.
- 4. Install a traffic light controlled pedestrian crossing where the cycle way along the Expressway crosses Otaihanga Road.
 Reasons: Safety. Moderate traffic speed.
- 5. Change the name of the stretch of Otaihanga Road from the junction with Ratanui Road to Old SH1 to be 'Ratanui Road'.
 Reasons: Remove confusion. Consistency: Ratanui Road would be a Local Community Collector;

Otaihanga Road would be a purely residential road with no through access.

- 6. Replace the junction at Ratanui Road and Otaihanga Road with a roundabout. Reasons: Safety. Improve and regulate traffic flow and speed.
- 7. Construct properly formed pavements and cycleways along the entire lengths of Ratanui Road and Otaihanga Road. Reasons: Safety. Utility.
- 8. Address the very narrow pavement where Ratanui Road joins Mazengarb Road. The pavement here is so narrow that a wheelie bin completely blocks the pavement such that pedestrians are forced to step into the road. Reason: Safety.
- 9. Make provision now for a future bus service along Ratanui Road by planning where the bus stops will be such that bays can be designed to allow traffic to flow safely passed a stopped bus. Reason: Safety.
- 10. Reopen the access from Otaihanga Road to the Expressway going south towards Wellington. This was the main access point for contractors when the Expressway was being built. Reasons: Utility. Reduce through traffic on Ratanui Road / Guilford Drive / Te Roto Drive and Old SH1 / Paraparamu Lights.
