PRCB 18/09/121 Update: Electric Vehicle Car Chargers and Parking

Vanessa Crowe, Sustainable Communities Co-ordinator, gave a presentation around the Kāpiti Horowhenua Electric Roads Project that included a trans-regional partnership between the Kāpiti Coast District Council, Horowhenua District Council, Electra Ltd, ChargeNet NZ and the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Authority. Members' questions were responded to.
