

Waikanae – connected, accessible and thriving



Over the next 12 to 24 months approximately \$5.6 million will be invested in revitalising the Waikanae town centre. This includes construction work and economic and community development initiatives. Our goal is to create a connected, accessible and thriving town centre with a strong sense of place and identity.



Waikanae Masterplan

- Marae integration
 The creation of a gathering space outside the Marae, and an accessible cultural and artistic link to the wide Waikanae town centre and GWRC car park.
- The cultural thread

 The establishment and strengthening of a continuous visual link with Waikanae's heritage and cultural background.
- Mahara entrance
 The 'opening-up' of a new Mahara Place to the local road, new pedestrian links, and surrounding businesses.
- Mahara Place
 An upgrade to the existing Mahara precinct to encourage new business and pedestrian links.
- Mahara Square
 The creation of an integrated parkscape for relaxation, rest, play, and events in Mahara Square.
- Waikanae Library/Mahara Gallery
 New seating and planting at Mahara Gallery and the
 Waikanae Public Library.
- Improved connections to the train station
 The upgrade of the main road crossing and improvements in paths/wayfaring to and from GWRC car park.
- Waikanae River link
 The establishment of a shared path to the Waikanae
 River for pedestrians and cyclists.
- Te Moana Road and Ngaio Road intersections
 Intersection upgrades to better integrate with the new local road dynamic.
- Linear Park
 The establishment of the parkscape connecting the train station with the Waikanae town centre and the main road.
- NZTA's \$3million investment on the carriageway modification of the State Highway in Waikanae to achieve a safe local road environment.
